Dress Code

Golf Course & Practice Areas

Revised on August 2016

Members and their guests are required to respect the Club's dress code requirements and maintain a level of dress commensurate with a private golf club. Proper golf course attire shall be considered the minimum standard of dress, except where noted, while on the golf course and practice areas. **Members are responsible for ensuring that their guests are in full compliance with the Clubs dress code requirements.** To assist with the interpretation of the dress code, members and guests are required to observe the following minimum requirements or contact the Club Management or Golf Professional Staff for guidance.

The following items are Not Acceptable on the Golf Course or Practice Areas:

- Exercise and fitness clothing, sweat or yoga pants, gym shorts.
- Tennis shorts, short shorts, cut offs or pool wear.
- Clothing bearing offensive logo's, emblems, slogans, team jerseys, camouflage (unless specific to an event).
- Worn out, torn or stained clothing.
- Hat and caps, visors, worn backwards.
- Hooded sweatshirts (e.g. team type, unless specific to an event).
- No denim jeans.

Specific to Men:

Male members and their guests must have "polo" golf shirts tucked in at all times. All shirts must have a collar. Mock neck shirts are permitted.

Not Allowed - Pants or shorts with external pleated "patch" pockets (e.g. cargo pants or cargo shorts, shorts that have any oversize pockets on the outside of the shorts).

Specific to Women:

Leggings may only be worn under skirts, skorts, and golf dresses.

Shorts and skirts are to be no shorter than 6" above the knee.

Sleeveless shirts are permitted when constructed with a shoulder width.

Finished, collarless shirts are permitted.

Not Allowed - Casual wear in the style of halter tops, tube tops, narrow racer-back tops and midriff revealing clothing.
